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## Identification of Single-user Toilet Facilities as All-gender Restrooms

## BACKGROUND

Assembly Bill 1732 (Chapter 818, Statues 2016) was signed into law on September 29, 2016, to create Health and Safety Code Section 118600, relating to the identification of single-user toilet facilities as all-gender toilet facilities.

Health and Safety Code Section 118600 requires:

- (a) All single-user toilet facilities in any business establishment, place of public accommodation, or state or local government agency shall be identified as all-gender toilet facilities by signage that complies with Title 24 of the California Code of Regulations, and designed for use by no more than one occupant at a time or for family or assisted use.
- (b) During any inspection of a business or a place of public accommodation by an inspector, building official, or other local official responsible for code enforcement, the inspector of official may inspect for compliance with this section.
- (c) For the purpose of this section, "single-user toilet facility" means a toilet facility with no more than one water closet and one urinal with a locking mechanism controlled by the user.
- (d) This section shall become operative on March 1, 2017.

## IMPLEMENTATION GUIDELINES

As of March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2017, all single-user toilet facilities in a business establishment, place of public accommodation, or state or local government agency shall be identified as all-gender toilet facilities per the following guidelines:

- For the purpose of implementing the Assembly Bill 1732, a single-user toilet facility means a private toilet facility that has a single water closet (toilet) or a single toilet and a urinal, is intended for use by only one person at a time, generally has no stall enclosure around the toilet, and has a door that can be locked from the inside by the room occupant.
- Symbol on the entrance door: "Unisex" geometric symbol (i.e., an equivalent triangle superimposed onto a circle) in compliance with CBC 11B-703.7.2.6.3 shall be mounted on the entrance door of a single-user toilet sanitary to identify such sanitary facility as an all-gender toilet facility. No text, braille, or pictogram is allowed on the symbol.
- Designation sign on wall: When provided, wall-mounted designation signs adjacent to the entrance door must comply with the technical requirements for raised characters (CBC 11B-703.2), braille (CBC 11B-703.3), visual characters (CBC 11B-703.5), pictogram (CBC 11B-703.6), and the requirements for installation height and location (CBC 11B-703.4). Pictogram is not required, but if used, it is preferred to be a simple picture and must comply with Section CBC 11B-703.6.
- These guidelines are applicable to all projects currently under plan review. For the projects approved prior to March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2017, but still under construction, all single-user toilet facilities with gender specific symbols or designation signs are required to comply with the guidelines stated above.

- City-owned, leased or operated facilities shall comply with the guidelines stated above.
- Implementation of the Statue for existing private-owned buildings not doing any renovation or alteration is to be effected by the property owners. Building Division will enforce the implementation by complaint. A building permit shall be obtained prior to the start of the implementation process.
