Diversity Task Force reports to City Council

After more than a year and a half of collaboration, the Community-based Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Task Force has presented a series of recommendations to the Walnut Creek City Council. Fifty-five Walnut Creek residents applied for the 13 open spots on the Task Force, which began meeting in 2021. While the pandemic forced early monthly meetings to be virtual, members worked collaboratively and creatively with a goal of making Walnut Creek a community where everyone feels a sense of belonging. Task Force members presented their recommendations for next steps for the City, asking Walnut Creek to demonstrate an ongoing commitment to DEI work, including continued staff training. They also suggested establishing a welcoming ordinance, hosting community listening and learning events, bringing more awareness to the countywide mental health crisis response program, and more. The City Council established DEI work as one of its five Council priorities for the coming two years. City staff will return with workplans and quarterly progress reports to support the recommendations.

Capacity expands for countywide mobile crisis mental health response

Considerable progress is being made on the countywide mobile crisis response program known as "A3." The goal of the program is to ensure that anyone who lives anywhere in Contra Costa County can have timely and appropriate crisis mental health response 7 days a week, 24 hours per day. Although one of the

challenges has been hiring enough behavioral health workers to staff the response teams, the number of teams has increased from 2 to 15, with an average response time of one to two hours. The hours of operation have also increased, with teams available from 8:00 a.m. until 12:30 a.m. There were nearly 3,000 calls for help in 2022, and though most issues are resolved by speaking with someone by phone, mobile teams were dispatched more than 500 times last year.

DOWNTOWN STREETS UPDATE

One of the most unique features about Broadway Plaza is the fact it's an open-air regional shopping center with 80 worldclass shopping destinations and eateries, all intricately lining the streets of Walnut Creek. Soon, the City will be re-opening Broadway Plaza Street once again to vehicular traffic, and ask our patrons to be sure to watch out for pedestrians crossing the street. The street is a public street, and Broadway Plaza will work in partnership with the City when it is appropriate to close the street from time to time for events. Broadway Plaza continues to work very closely with the City of Walnut Creek, including the Police Department, to continually monitor and address traffic and safety concerns.

SUSTAINABILITY ACTION PLAN TO BE PRESENTED TO CITY

The City of Walnut Creek has been a leader on environmental action, going back to the 1970s when the community passed a bond measure to preserve its open space. In 2012, the City adopted its first Climate Action Plan to outline how the City and community will reduce greenhouse gas emissions in the community. The Climate Action Plan successfully helped the City meet its goal to reduce community-wide emissions by 15% from 2012 to 2020. In recent years, Walnut Creek's City Council has repeated reaffirmed its commitment to sustainability and directed staff to prepare an updated Sustainability Action Plan.

The Sustainability Action Plan addresses greenhouse gas emissions and provides a more comprehensive



approach to encompass environmental sustainability and climate resilience. In coordination with the community, the City has been developing the Plan over the last several years. In April, the City released the draft Sustainability Action Plan and sought feedback through a community workshop, online survey, and pop-up events in order to inform next steps for adoption and

implementation.

At the June 20 City Council meeting, the City Council will review the draft Sustainability Action Plan and feedback from the community. The final version of the Sustainability Action Plan will be presented for adoption at the July 18 City Council meeting. Following adoption, the City and community will begin implementing the Plan's strategies and actions. The public is encouraged to attend these meetings to learn more about the Plan and provide feedback.

Crosswalk improvements

Pedestrian safety improvements at several crosswalks are coming soon, with construction anticipated to begin in late spring/early summer. Six crosswalks are slated for upgrades:

• N. Main Street at Lesnick Lane, 3rd Avenue, and SOS Drive

· Bancroft Road at Stratton Road and at Gill Port Lane

• Mt. Diablo Boulevard at Bont Lane

Many of the City's crosswalks are located at stop signs or traffic signals that help slow drivers.

These locations were selected because they are in areas where drivers must yield to pedestrians when they're present. The goal is to slow drivers down and make pedestrians more visible. All of the above crosswalks require people to cross five lanes of traffic on busy streets with fast-moving cars, with speed limits ranging from 30 to 40 mph. At higher speeds, drivers need more time to react to a pedestrian in the street. This can result in a lower likelihood that drivers will yield in time for pedestrians. Additionally,

faster moving vehicles cause more harm to pedestrians if a collision occurs, resulting in higher chances for pedestrians to be seriously or fatally injured.

Hardened lane lines (solid white stripes) and vertical posts will be added to each crosswalk approach. The combination of hardened lane lines and posts will serve to narrow travel lanes, which in turn reduces speeds. They also serve as an additional visual signal to drivers that there may be people walking in the street.


These safety improvements align with the City's Local Roadway Safety Plan, available on the City's website. The Local Roadway Safety Plan is a framework that guides decision-making and priorities for improving traffic safety on Walnut Creek's streets.


Youth voices have been represented within the City since the 15-member Youth Leadership Commission was created in 2017 to engage the future leaders of Walnut Creek by encouraging youth to take an active leadership role in the community.

Youth Leadership Commissioners attend regular commission meetings, advise staff and the City Council on the youth perspective as part of program and policy development, learn about the City government and operations, and develop and implement their own projects.

Beginning in the fall of 2021, the Youth Leadership Commission worked to develop a policy project that aimed to expand youth engagement in Walnut Creek and provide additional opportunities for youth voices to be heard in local government. The Walnut Creek City Council approved "A Seat at the Table", a proposal from the Commission that is currently piloting inclusion of youth members on City Commissions. The oneyear pilot program added youth members to the Park, Recreation and Open Space Commission, the Arts Commission and the Transportation Commission. Additionally, youth membership has been added to some of the City's other boards and task forces, including the Police Chief's Community Advisory Board and the Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Task Force.

"We are the future," said Jerlene Chiu, Youth Leadership Commissioner, "and I just want to make a place in Walnut Creek that we are able to support youth voices and make them heard as best as possible."

Applications for the 2023-2024 Youth Leadership Commission will be open through August 18, 2023. Passionate, engaged Walnut Creek residents in grades 9-12 are encouraged to apply. Learn more about the Youth Leadership Commission and apply on the City's website.



Prepare for natural emergencies

Natural emergencies come in many forms in California – earthquake, fire, and flood. With the unexpectedly wet January behind us, which hopefully will mitigate a strong fire season, it is a good time to revisit your preparedness:

- Designate a place where your family can convene in the event of a natural disaster – flooding, fire or earthquake.
- Make an emergency supply kit for your home. Supply lists are provided here for your home, work, car, and pets on the City's website at walnutcreek.org/emergency. You can also register there for emergency alerts.

• Prepare your home. Consider seismic retrofitting and hardening your home. If you live in a flood zone, consider retrofitting your home for flooding by elevating your home and its utilities/equipment and wet proofing your garage or basement. 

HELL RIDGE IS ONE OF THE CITY'S MOST TREASURED open spaces. In fact, Shell Ridge's beauty launched the local movement to preserve Walnut Creek's open space in the 1970s. In 1974, Walnut Creek residents secured a \$6.8 million bond, allowing Shell Ridge and other open spaces to be preserved. Thanks to the foresight of Walnut Creek's residents, the City now manages 2,700 acres of dedicated Open Space.

Shell Ridge is the largest of City's four open space areas, covering more than 1,400 acres. It features the Borges Ranch and 31 miles of multi-use trails. It serves as the gateway to Mt. Diablo State Park and East Bay Regional Park District's Diablo Foothills and Castle Rock Park. Shell Ridge receives hundreds of thousands of visitors per year. In addition to recreation opportunities, Shell Ridge provides habitat for plants and wildlife, with a variety of ecosystems such as oak woodlands and grass savannahs.

One particularly special feature of Shell Ridge is its old growth forest, which was recently recognized by the national Old Growth Forest Network. The Old Growth Forest Network selects the oldest known forests within each county across the nation. The old growth forest within Shell Ridge plays a vital role in the ecosystem. The Fossil Hill nature trail, which was once underwater, features unique geological and ecological features. From March to September, you can witness a colorful display of native wildflowers in a variety of areas that have been carefully restored through partnerships with the Walnut Creek Open Space Foundation. The park is open from sunrise to sunset. The main park entrance is at Old Borges Ranch, located at 1035 Castle Rock Road.
