Get data on A3 program

A new data dashboard is giving some clarity to the impacts of countywide behavioral health program known as A3, which aims to provide timely and appropriate mental health services to "anyone, anywhere, anytime" in Contra Costa County. The City of Walnut Creek has been involved in the development of the A3 program since its beginnings. The new resource centralizes A3's reporting call volume, mobile response details, client demographics and other key metrics. Users have the ability to filter data by city, number of people served, total calls, or mobile responses. Measure O

YOUR MEASURE O TAX DOLLARS AT WORK

The City has taken major steps forward in the effort to replace the aging facilities located in Heather Farm Park with the approval of

schematic designs for two new pools and an updated community center. Community members provided significant input on the design and layout of the

facilities, and the City Council has approved plans that will guide further refinement of the project. The City worked hard to develop a plan that can balance the many users of both facilities. The design work is expected to be complete next spring, and construction will last through 2027. The new facility will continue to support the varied programming needs of the community. The majority of the

funding for this project will be through the voterapproved Measure O. Meanwhile, the Citizens' Oversight Committee formed to review financial documents related to

Measure O spending has begun meeting. The five member committee was created by the City Council to review and report on the receipt and expenditure of funds from the sales tax increase.

Charges filed in connection with Louis Vuitton theft

Three people are facing charges in connection with the theft at the Louis Vuitton store in Broadway Plaza last fall. In the 4:00 a.m. hour on October 3, a stolen Range Rover was driven through the front window of the store. Walnut Creek Police officers were on the scene within a minute of receiving the 911 call. More than \$246,000 in merchandise was stolen, leading to an investigation that has been tied to similar cases throughout the Bay Area. Detectives Jenna Kolmeister and Matt Smith began investigating the case which broadened to include Concord

Police staff working jointly and resulting in more than 400 hours of detective work and 3 arrests on multiple felony charges. The Contra Costa FBI Safe Streets Task Force and officers from other local agencies also took part in the complex investigation. The suspects were linked to more than two dozen commercial burglaries committed

throughout the state, with more than 90 warrants authorized and eleven search warrants served at various locations in the Bay Area. The detectives continue to follow leads, and the California Attorney General's office has taken on the case due to so many jurisdictions involved.




RecycleSmart Survey

Paving projects planned for Walnut Creek this summer



This summer will be a busy one for City Public Works crews, with a variety of projects planned to improve City streets. The City's Pavement Management Program aims to maintain City roads in a cost-effective manner. Rehabilitation and repaying projects will take place soon in 4 areas: Locust Street between Civic Drive and Mt. Diablo Blvd., Mt. Diablo Blvd. west of California Blvd., and Wiget Lane between Ygnacio Valley Road and Lennon Lane. Bicycle lane improvements will be included in the work on Wiget. Additionally, slurry seal will be applied in the Livorna Estates and Castle Hill neighborhoods. These critical infrastructure projects represent a substantial \$5 million investment in the City's road network, with funding coming from Measure J and gas tax revenues.



Congratulations to the City Staff Employee of the Year and Team of the Year

ALNUT CREEK'S STAFF WORKS HARD TO PROVIDE PROGRAMS AND services for the community, and once a year the City acknowledges that work at an Employee Recognition Event. From a pool comprised of many nominees, a staff team and an individual staff member received special recognition. Matt Redmond, Associate Traffic Engineer in the Public Works Department, was named Employee of the Year not only for his regular commitment to his work, but also in recognition of his selection for a prestigious Pioneer award from the Federal Highway Administration.



He received it for creating a technology that can be used by any government agency to efficiently monitor traffic safety issues that relate to required maintenance. Redmond said, "I have incredible admiration for the entire Public Works Department at Walnut Creek, an incredible team of talented and dedicated workers, who inspire me with their commitment to making our City a better place."

The Team of the Year honors went to the Human Resources Recruitment Team, which did a remarkable job in helping to restore the City's workforce following major turnover during COVID. Nearly 90 new staff members were brought on board to Walnut Creek's workforce during 2023. This has been instrumental in allowing the City to return to a normal vacancy rate and provide the quality services and programs residents deserve.

Staff members who reached milestone years of service were also recognized, including 3 who achieved 25 years of service to the City.


First Wednesday returns in August

KNOW YOUR WALNUT CREEK PARKS:

TICE VALLEY PARK



ESTLED ALONG TICE CREEK NOT FAR FROM ROSSMOOR IS Tice Valley Park, which is adjacent to the Tice Valley Community Gymnasium. More than 8 acres, it includes playgrounds for kids up to age 12, and a picnic area with tables and barbecues. There is plenty of parking and a popular soccer field.

The gym offers versatile spaces for a wide variety of sport-related programs, games, tournaments and classes. The gym also features spaces for rent. A classroom, with capacity for 30 people, offers the right space and equipment for a meeting. The exercise room can accommodate

up to 75 people, working well for fitness and dance-related activities. And the gymnasium itself is available for rental with three full size courts. There is capacity for more than 1,300 people on all three courts combined. The City has equipment for basketball, volleyball and badminton.

Located at 2055 Tice Valley Blvd., the Park it is open from dawn to dusk, and offers beautiful views of trees located all around the property.



Measure O funding new lighting at Tice Valley Park

Funds from Measure O are being used to install a lighting system for the soccer field at Tice Valley Park, extending its usability into evening hours. The Walnut Creek Soccer Club also made a considerable donation towards the project. Four new light poles with LED fixtures will be placed to provide illumination while minimizing the impact outside of the field. The field could be used for practices from December to February, with adult fitness programs potentially running until 10:00 p.m. By extending availability of the field into evening hours, the project will cater to a wider range of schedules among Park users. The LED fixtures reflects a commitment to environmental sensitivity, ensuring the benefits of increased field use are balanced with the preservation of the park's natural surroundings. The project is expected to be complete by the end of the year.
